- If you do not pass, we will refer you to our partner IT Core Skills program.

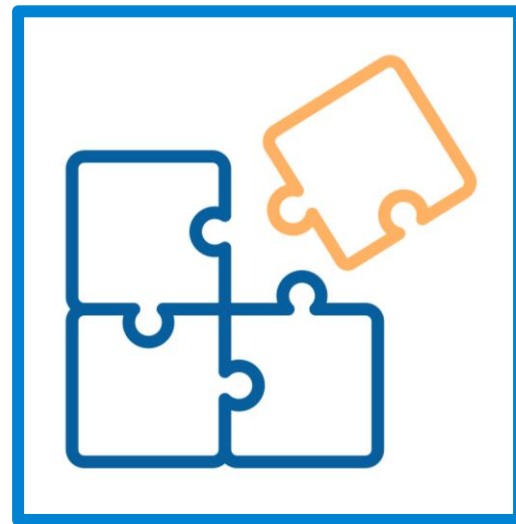

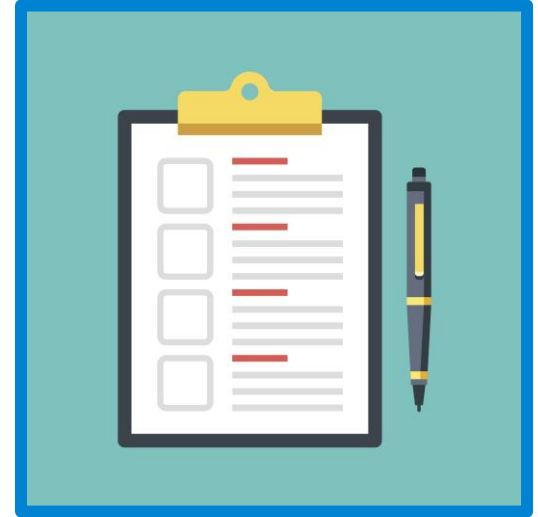
IT Career Lab's Grant Owned Process:

- **This process is for anyone going through the IT Career Lab owned grant.**
- Send a resume, complete the prescreen, Windows 10 Northstar Assessment (must pass).
- Complete the IT Career Lab grant application and the Tennessean form.
- You will be asked to provide copies of your ID (social security card, or work authorization).
- Application will be reviewed and if accepted, you will be able to enroll in IT Career Lab.



IT Career Lab Grant Partner Process:

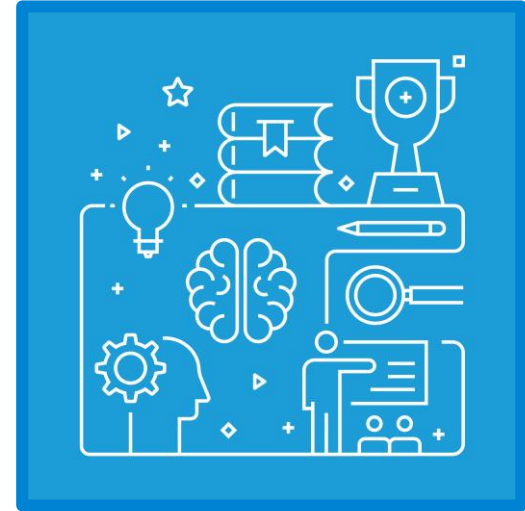
- **This process is for anyone who is going through our grant partner (WIOA, Dislocated Worker, etc), process.**
 - Send over your resume, complete prescreen, complete and pass the Windows 10 Northstar assessment.
 - Complete grant partner application – two forms. They will then conduct an intake with you over the phone where they will review your application.
- * Expected process is three to six weeks minimum



IT Career Lab Grant Partner Process Cont.:

- You may have to complete the Wonderlic (basic math and reading assessment), 20 minutes each, can be taken remotely. Waived for those with a bachelors.
- Once completed, you will be assigned to an employment counselor.
- Complete their paperwork, training proposal (must be approved by employment counselor). You will be asked to provide copies of your ID (social security card, proof of residency, etc.).
- After everything is completed and you are approved and accepted into the grant program, the IT Career Lab enrollment process would begin.
- If you are already in the Dislocated Worker/WIOA program, please let us know and provide us with your employment counselors contact info.

* Expected process is three to six weeks minimum

- August 10, 2021 | Deadline to enroll is August 2, 2021

CCNA

- July 26, 2021 | Deadline to enroll is July 19, 2021

AZURE:

August 17, 2021 | Deadline to enroll is August 10, 2021

→ Virtual Orientation and Enrollment will happen the Thursday before class and laptop pick up will happen the Monday before classes start.
